


ORDINANCE

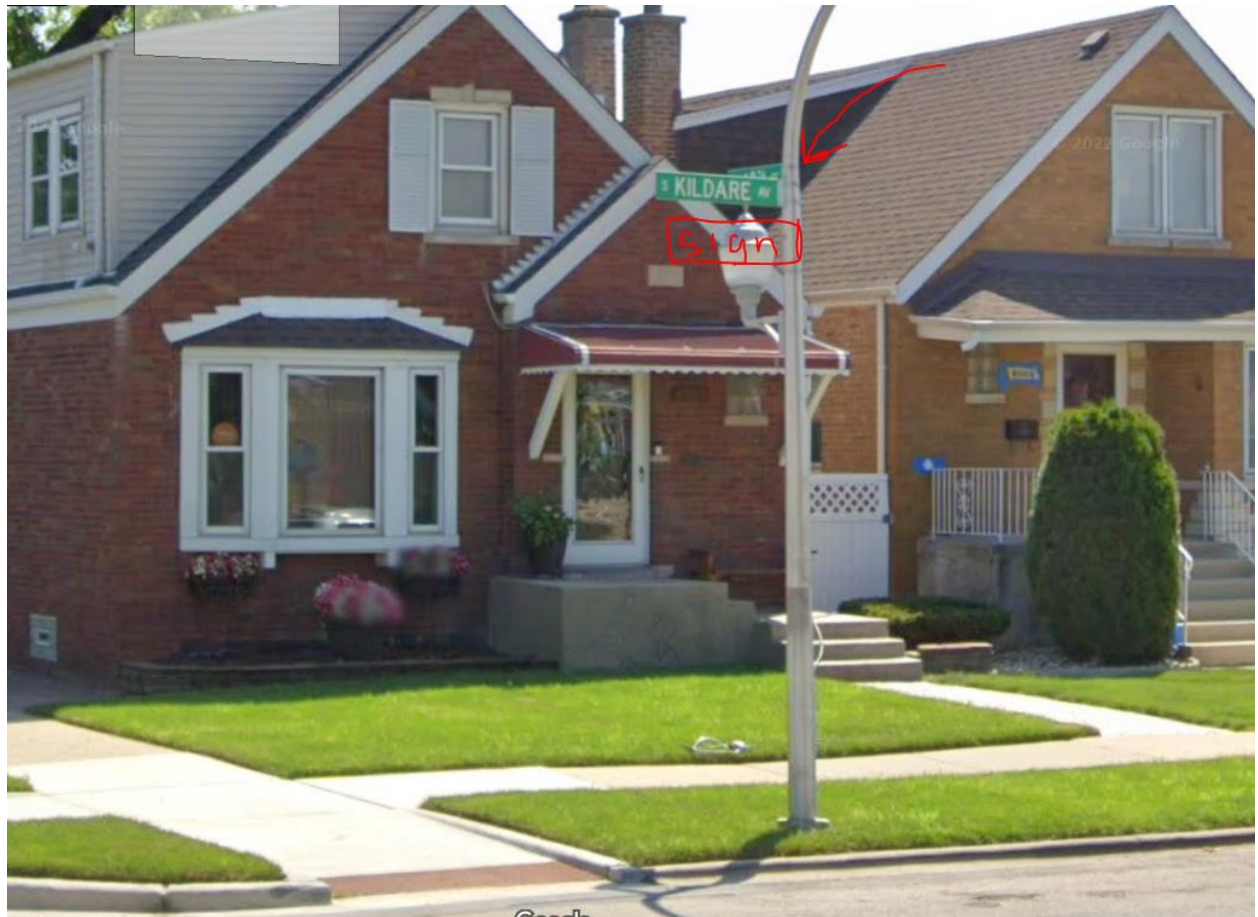
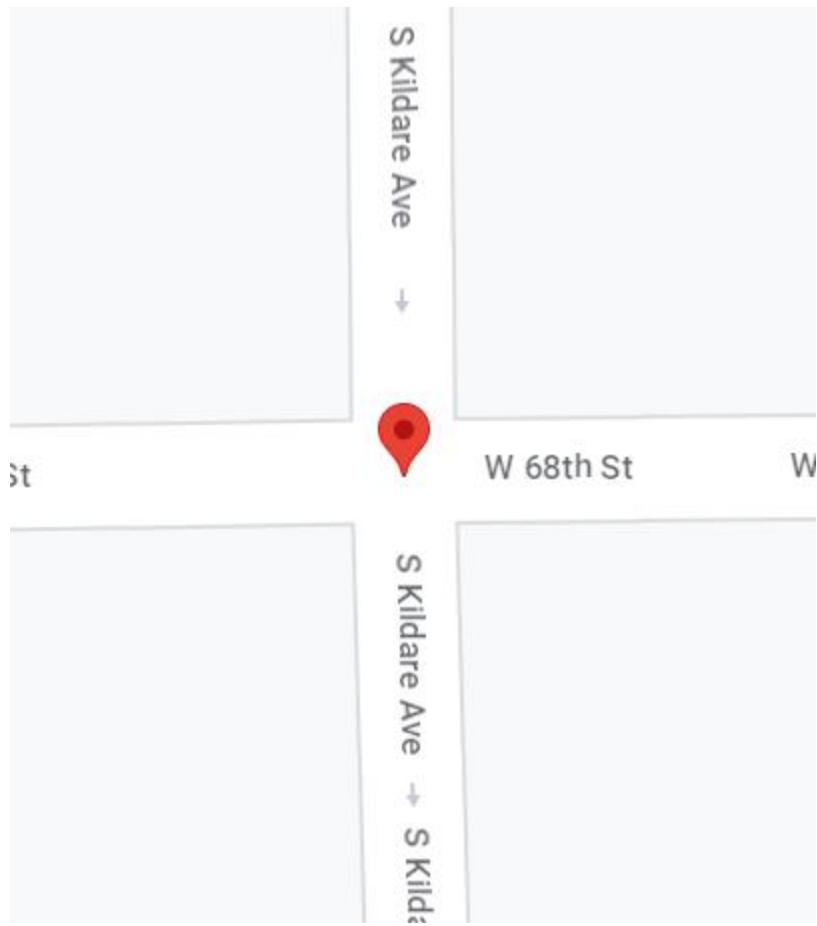
BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to Section 2-8-040 of the Municipal Code of Chicago, which allows erection of honorary street name designations, the Commissioner of Chicago Department of Transportation shall take the necessary action for standardization of on the SE corner of W 68th Street and S Kildare Ave. as "Honorary Mateo Zastro Way"

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and publication.

Mateo loved to play dinosaurs and so him and his brother would combine their Dino and superhero toys to play daily after school. When Messiah got his game system him and Mateo began to call themselves "gamers" and would pretend to make YouTube videos as they played their games. Every night they would pick a movie to watch before bed and during the summer they enjoyed splashing in the pool from the moment they walked in from school or camp.

Mateo loved spending time with Grandpa Mikey who had him majority of the time while mom worked. They would go to the park, get snacks, walk the dog, and watch movies. He also got to go upstairs from Grandpa Mikey's and play with Luca baby at Uncle Juan & Christina's. He very much loved them even though sometimes he showed tough love.

Mateo also loved being with great grandma Lucy and Papa. They took Mateo on his first waterpark hotel stay and first camping trip. He enjoyed both. Even though he was young, he got to experience so much. He loved visits with all the Aunties Margaret, Dawne, Margarita (Gooly) & their kids Margarita Clara, Kirsten, Alexis. Who are all young adults but would run around and play like kids with him whenever they visit. Tia Loopz and Uncle Eddie always came with the Spanish music for Mateo they were teaching him his Mexican side. Mateo always thought of Uncle Manuel as a superhero so every time he would come over Mateo would shout with excitement "yay Uncle Manuel's here uncle iron man" is here.

Nana and Nestor took us on a road trip to Tennessee to eat at a restaurant called the aquarium. Mateo enjoyed watching the sharks and fish swimming around as he ate. Since we were halfway there, we decided to go to Georgia as well to visit the family there. Mateo enjoyed playing with the cousins there it was a great experience because my plan was to make sure my kids and my cousins kids got to grow up knowing each other and making memories together. Something we rarely got to do as kids. Mateo enjoyed the scenery of the mountains rainbows sunrises and sunsets as well as the animals we had seen along the way.

Mateo had a favorite /special Tia, Star who he looked up to so much. She never failed to amaze him she never let her situation of being disabled stop her from doing anything and Mateo admired her for that. He was 3 years old, but he understood so much of what was going on around him and he thought it was so cool how she would get around the house or use her feet to write and draw. When she wasn't around, He would still copy her and say, "I can do it too because that's what my Tia does."

The night before Mateo passed, he called his GG (great grandma Zastro) and told her he would like for her to come visit him this weekend because he missed her, and we rarely see her but he enjoyed every visit we did have with her because she would always sing and dance with him since he was a baby.

Mateo was a super Dino fan. He knew every Dinosaur there was. When he started daycare, he went in with T-Rex arms and roared at the class as they welcomed him on his new journey. He eventually transitioned from daycare to pre k and should've received his certificate this past May. Unfortunately, he never got to see his 4th birthday or hit that milestone of accomplishments.

September was the month we were accomplishing a lot of progress for Mateo's procedures for his teeth. He was super excited because his gums were bothering him a lot. It was also his sister's birthday a week before he was murdered. We took them bowling that was Mateo's first time being able to bowl on his own. He had so much fun.



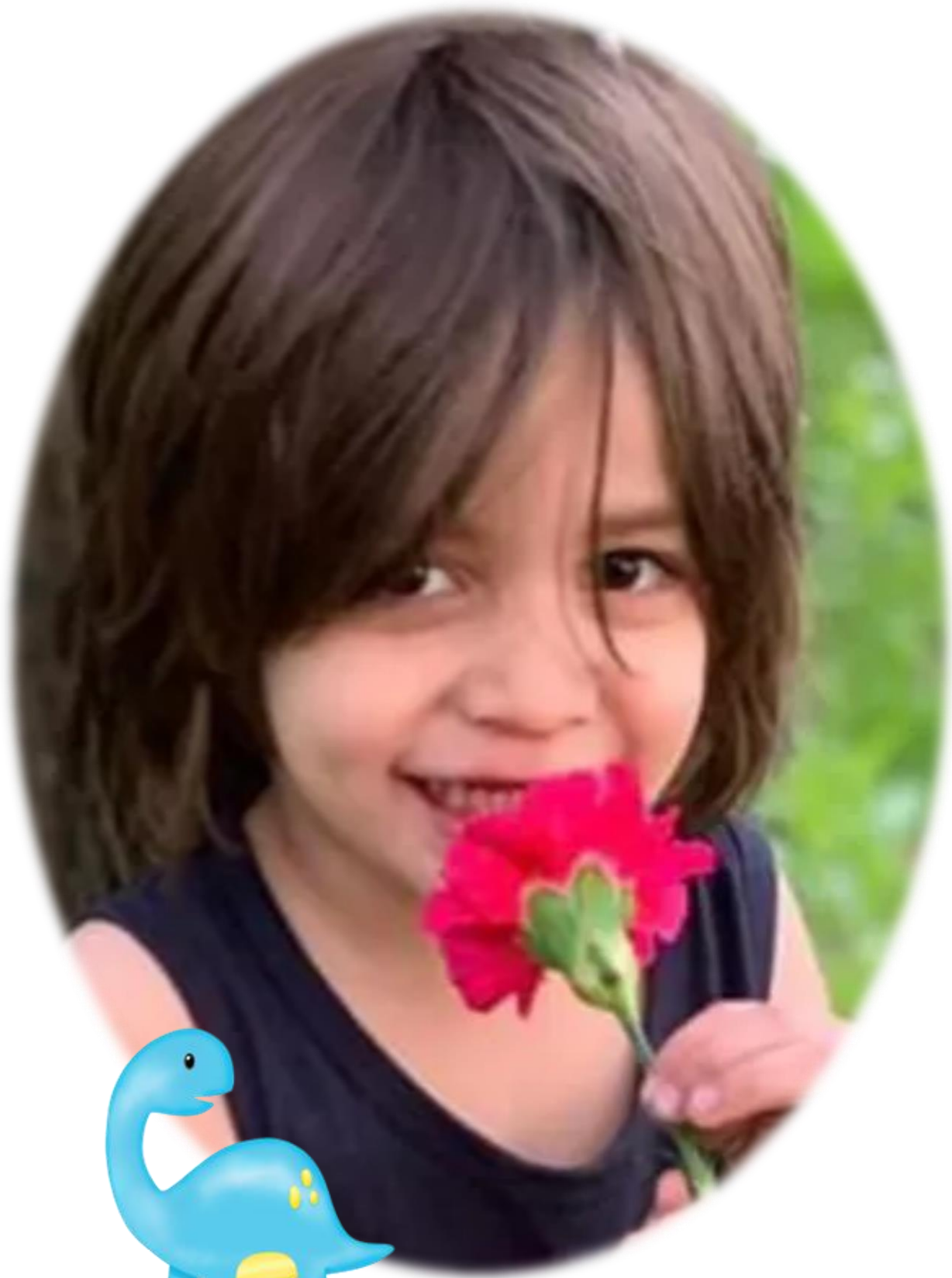
