

**ORDINANCE**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO:**

**SECTION 1.** Chapter 9-88 of the Municipal Code of Chicago is hereby amended by inserting a new Section 9-88-050, as follows:

**9-88-050 Police Report Portal.**

Within six months after the effective date of this section, the Superintendent of Police, in coordination with the Department of Technology and Innovation, shall establish a secure online portal providing access to police reports. Such database must, at a minimum, limit access to: (a) the individual who filed the police report or their authorized representative, at no cost; and (b) members of the Police Department, the Traffic Compliance Administrator and their designees, and the administrative law officer overseeing any applicable administrative adjudication. Police reports shall be made available on the portal within one week of the filing of the report.

**SECTION 2.** Chapter 9-100 of the Municipal Code of Chicago is hereby amended by deleting Section 9-100-130 in its entirety, and by inserting a new Section 9-100-130, as follows:


**9-100-130 Owner of vehicle not liable for violations when vehicle or state registration plates reported stolen.**

(a) No owner of a vehicle or state registration plates that have been reported stolen shall be liable for any parking, standing, compliance, automated traffic law enforcement system, or automated speed enforcement system violation involving such vehicle during the period that such vehicle or state registration plates were stolen.

(b) To the extent permitted by law, the Superintendent of Police, in coordination with the Traffic Compliance Administrator, shall waive all traffic violations, compliance violations, parking violations, standing violations, automated speed enforcement system violations, automated traffic law enforcement system violations, or any other citation issued to the owner of a vehicle or state registration plates that have been reported stolen that were issued after such vehicle or state registration plates were stolen.

(c) The Superintendent of Police and the Traffic Compliance Administrator shall promulgate rules for the administration of this section.

**SECTION 3.** This ordinance shall take effect upon passage.
